Recycling Options:

- Automotive – Plastic containers (empty) – includes automotive fluid containers (engine oil, chain oil, power steering fluid, brake fluid, transmission fluid)
- E-waste Recycling (TV's, Computers, tablets, printers & accessories, microwaves)
- Household Electrical Products – Small Appliances, Audio Visual, Telecom, Power & Air Tools, Lawn & Garden, Games, Toys & Music, Solar Panels
- Paint Recycling (includes aerosols)
- Pesticide Chemical Containers (triple rinsed)
- Used Oil, Oil Filters & Plastic Oil Containers (lids must be removed from containers); DEF containers

Garbage Accepted in Bins:

- Household garbage (bagged and tied)
- Ashes (boxed or bagged and tied)
- Box springs, mattresses
- Cardboard
- Compost, grass, straw, weeds, lake weeds (bagged & tied)
- Demolition/Renovation (residential); includes: drywall, roofing shingles, decking, vinyl siding, windows, doors, flooring, carpet
- Furniture, including beds, chairs, couches, tables, dressers, toilets, basins, sinks, etc.
- Hot tubs (cut up in quarters or smaller; able to fit easily in bin)
- Paint Cans (empty/dry)
- Plastics
- Wood (treated, painted; cut in lengths to fit in bin)

Not Accepted:

- Ammunition
- Animal carcasses, hides or animal parts
- Appliances
- Automobiles, motors, etc.
- Batteries (auto)
- Campers, RV's, boats
- Concrete, concrete blocks or rocks
- Dynamite
- Fluorescent tubes
- Hazardous & bio-hazardous waste
- Hot water heaters
- Lawnmowers/lawn tractors
- Liquid waste: oil or oil filters, pesticides, antifreeze, camping fuel or other flammable liquids, sewage, any toxic liquid
- Metal
- Any large or heavy metal items – including barbeques, bed frames, metal bath tubs, bicycles, desks
- Poisons
- Propane Tanks
- Seeds or grains
- Soil or sod
- Toxic weeds
- Tires
- Trees & Shrubs
- Tree stumps or roots
- Wire
- Wood (clean, burnable)
