Title      Reserve Funding

### 1. Policy Statement:

1.1. The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines and controls to govern the management and administration of reserves and reserve funds. Strong reserve fund management provides a mechanism to ensure that the organization can meet current and future infrastructure requirements as identified in the Strategic and 5 Year Capital Plans. Reserve funds can reduce the need for external debt financing, provide financial stability during times of economic volatility, mitigate unreliable grant funding from other levels of government and the ever-present pressure to reduce municipal taxes.

### 2. Responsibilities:

- 2.1. Through the direction of Council, it shall be the responsibility of the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to:
- i. Ensure that Reserve Funds are invested in accordance with the procedures and guidelines laid out within the County's Investment Policy 12.3.1, and in conjunction with the Director of Finance.
- 2.2. It shall be the responsibility of the Director of Finance to:
- i. Make investments on behalf of the County in accordance with the procedures and guidelines laid out in this Policy, and in conjunction with the CAO.
  - ii. Ensure the County maintains sufficient working capital without compromising the operations of the County.

### 3. Guidelines:

- 3.1. All Reserve Transactions will be approved by Council.
- 3.2. All Reserves will be administered in accordance with current municipal policies, Public Sector Accounting Standards and Schedules "A" and "B".
- 3.3. All reserves must contain a purpose (description), funding source, minimum/maximum balance, application, duration and whether it is interest bearing.
- 3.4. All Reserves must fall under an approved Reserve Description. The establishment of a new Reserve, which will require a new Reserve Description, must be approved by Council.
- 3.5. Reserves will be funded from internal or external sources as defined in the Reserve Descriptions.
- 3.6. Funding to and from the Reserve will be approved through Council via:
  - i. existing municipal policies;
  - ii. the annual budget process.
  - iii. the year-end reserve request and approval process.

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- iv. Council resolution.
- 3.7 As part of the year-end process for Reserves that have Optimal Balances, an assessment will be made between the actual designated Reserve balance and the recommended Optimal Balance. Reserves which are lower than their established Optimal Balance will be considered in the distribution of the annual operating surplus. Reserves which exceed their established Optimal Balance will be considered for redesignation.
- 3.8 Interest earnings will be applied to the Reserves which have been deemed interest bearing as indicated in Schedules “A” and “B”.
- 3.9 Transfers from reserves may not exceed the fund balance unless it can be proven that future transfers will result in a positive balance.
- 3.10 Interest will be paid to all interest-bearing accounts based on the average annual balance, at the annual average rate of return that is earned through the investment account.
- 3.11 Program specific reserve funds are intended to accumulate the money collected for specific initiatives or programs stipulated at the time of collection.
- 3.12 Administration will annually provide Council with:
  - i. Actual year end reserve fund balances.
  - ii. Five-year, projected, uncommitted reserve fund balances.
  - iii. Five-year, anticipated reserve contributions and draws as per the 5 Year Capital Plan approved by Council.
- 3.13 The Finance Department, with the CAO, will review the reserves policy a minimum of every two (2) years.
