

Proposed Changes to Capital Budget 2025

2025 Capital Budget focuses on:

- ERP System Implementation
- Carry Forward Projects: totaling \$9.7 million including:
 - Township Road 472 Grading
 - SE and Area Drainage
 - Alder Flats Phase 1
 - Bridge File 75497
 - Winfield Lagoon
 - Village West Estates Wastewater
 - SCADA Upgrades
 - Transfer Station Upgrades
 - Buck Lake/ Alder Flats Fire Hall
 - Mulhurst Bay Landing Pad
- Exploration of light vehicle lease and rental model.
- Deferring Capital Grading projects to expand number of kms of Shoulder Pulls.
- Prioritizing completion of current paving projects, including RR 12 to Lakedell Transfer Station
- Develop a multi-year plan for hamlet and subdivision pavement with community engagement

Please note at the December 5, 2023, Council General Meeting, Council approved CG20231205.02 the Recreation Services Capital Plan which allocated \$150,000 for 2023 and 130,000 for 2024. Administration is requesting that Council increase the 2024 the LGFF Community Facility Funding allocation to \$150,000 for the 2025 fiscal year.

For additional consideration: LGFF - \$150,000 allocated to Recreation Capital, need to allocate another \$40,000 in order to qualify under LGFFs new guidelines.
